APR: Actual Outcome Number	(12) Other-must provide description in the box below If Other: Since initial grant funding was awarded in 2020, the Tribe has not yet implemented the Elder Rehab program due to lack of staffing to fully control and implement the program. The Tribe has made this program a priority in 2023. The Housing Department will be hiring a program Field Coordinator and will be securing contractors through the Tribe's procurement policy. The Tribe anticipates to begin the tribal member application process in early July with renovation activities beginning shortly thereafter. We are implementing a phased approach by first starting in Cascade County, one of the Tribe's service area, in 2023 and implementing the program in the three remaining service area counties in 2024 through exhaustion of funds or expiration of program funding.
Who Will Be Assisted	Eligible elder LST tribal members that meet the low-income guidelines and reside in the four county service area.
Types and Level of Assistance	Assistance will be limited to qualified home repairs for eligible elder LST tribal members. Qualified home repairs will include repairs that improve substandard conditions, energy efficiency, or unsafe/unsanitary conditions. This assistance may include home repairs for roofing, windows, sewer, electrical, heating, and plumbing. Financial assistance will be in the form of a home repair grant. The amount of a home repair grant will be made on a case-by-case determination but will not exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00).

The new, current Housing Director recently received HUD technical assistance training on self-monitoring plan and he will be conducting self-monitoring procedures for all programming.
